HER EXCELLENCY THE HONOURABLE BARBARA BAKER AC GOVERNOR OF TASMANIA DRAWING ROOM, WEDNESDAY 24 APRIL 2024

Good afternoon, everyone. I warmly welcome you all here today to acknowledge Scholars of the John Monash Foundation Scholarship Program and to thank key supporters of the General Sir John Monash Foundation.

I acknowledge the Muwinina people upon whose Country we gather, and today's Tasmanian Aboriginal Community, as ongoing custodians of Country. I recognise their enduring culture and continued connection to land, sea, and waters.

Sir John was one of Australia's greatest leaders both in military and in civilian life. Sir John had a commitment to community and education. He once said, "...equip yourself for life, not solely for your own benefit but for the benefit of the whole community." This philosophy is reflected in criteria of the prestigious Scholarship in his name. Sir John Monash scholars all have the qualities of commitment to academic excellence, leadership, and community service.²

Of the 264 Australians awarded a John Monash Foundation Scholarship and the opportunity to pursue post graduate studies overseas,³ nine only are Tasmanians. Two of those scholars were intending to join us here today. I understand that regrettably both have become unwell. They are:

- Anita George was a 2012 John Monash Scholar and completed a Master's of Public Affairs at Sciences Po University, Paris; and
- Catherine Stubberfield was awarded her scholarship in 2010, and completed a Master's in Human Rights and Democratisation, studying both at the European Inter-University Centre in Venice and at the University of Strasbourg.⁴
