The Festival of Voices was the first of Tasmania's mid-winter festivals. It was designed specifically to embrace the unique experience of winter. Each year there is a rich and varied program showcasing choral, contemporary and cabaret, while a range of educational opportunities and participatory experiences are provided to enliven the darkest of winters. The Festival has built a reputation as a winter school for choirs and attracts people who want to learn new repertoires, improve their singing or just enjoy group singing. The Festival continues to bring enjoyment and warmth to the people of Tasmania. It has also paved the way for the success of other events, such as Dark MOFO.

Now in your seventeenth year, the Festival attracts audiences of thousands over two weeks. On Sunday, we attended the moving performance of Handel's *Four Coronation Anthems* at our Federation Concert Hall. The uplifting effect was obvious on both the choir and the audience.

Tonight's two musical performances will each be around 20 minutes. First, the Cairns based Gondwana Chorale, has members from throughout Australia and range in age from 17 - 26. They will be followed by Concordis Chamber Choir, who started with a group of school leavers but has evolved into a group of more than 40 young men and women from Melbourne and around.
