He has won two World Single Handed Sawing Championships. Records show that he has won approximately 70 State titles in Single and Double Handed Sawing, and two Australian Single Championships – quite an achievement.

He's a fantastic ambassador for the sport. He has been President of the Southern Tasmanian Axemen's Association (STAA) and now currently the Patron. He is also still on the Woodchopping Committee of the RAST.

He is a Life Member of STAA and also the Royal Agricultural Society of Tasmania. Many people are now involved in Woodchopping because of this individual. Our RAST will be forever grateful for what he has done for the Show and, particularly, the Woodchopping section.

I now have the greatest of pleasure to announce that the Living Legend of the Show for 2023 is Mr Ian Scott.
