Please be seated.

Good afternoon. I warmly welcome you all to Government House.

May I begin by acknowledging the Muwinina people upon whose Country we gather, who flourished on Country as part of the South-East Nation of Aboriginal people. I acknowledge today's Tasmanian Aboriginal Community as ongoing custodians of Country and recognise their enduring culture and continued connection to land, sea, and waters.

As your Patron, and with Don your Vice-Patron, we are very pleased to host this event, celebrating International Volunteer Day [IVD] and recognising Hobart volunteers and members.

As we know, IVD is held annually on 5 December. This is the day mandated by the UN General Assembly.

The day is viewed as a special opportunity for volunteers and organisations to celebrate their efforts, to share their values, and, to promote their work among their communities, government authorities, non-governmental organisations, United Nations agencies, and the private sector.¹

The United Nations Volunteers program mobilises thousands of volunteers every year. It also contributes to peace and development by advocating for the recognition of volunteers across the globe and working to integrate volunteerism into development programming.
