Good evening, everyone. It is my great pleasure to join you all for this reception onboard HMAS *Hobart*, our magnificent Guided Missile Destroyer.

In those times, the citizens could refuse entry to armed groups for fear that they would be attacked. Freedom of City allowed forces to replenish supplies and rest in the protected area. This was extended to Naval vessels and units recognised by seaport cities.

So, Commander Brown and your crew, I wish you all our very best for the Freedom of Entry parade tomorrow. May I hope that you enjoy your visit in our wonderful city and port that shares its name with your warship. I am sure that you will continue the tradition of marching proudly, armed with swords drawn, bayonets fixed, colours flying, drums beating and band playing.
