CONSULAR CORPS OF TASMANIA REMARKS BY HER EXCELLENCY THE HONOURABLE BARBARA BAKER AC GOVERNOR OF TASMANIA GOVERNMENT HOUSE, THURSDAY 9 OCTOBER 2025

We always enjoy the Ambassadors' stays at Government House. On these visits, we hold a formal dinner, at which many of you have been guests. We showcase our Tasmanian produce on the dinner menu, and our chef explains the produce used. We also enjoy showing our visitors the tree plantings for Royalty and other dignitaries, of which Government House is very proud. We are the only Government House in the country that has such plantings.

Tonight, may we celebrate the outgoing Dean of the Consular Corps, Professor Nitin Verma, who has been the Honorary Consul for Timor-Leste in Tasmania since July 2006. He is well known to Government House through his

various roles and visits, including a recent visit with the President of Timor-Leste, José Ramos-Horta.

As Dean, Professor Verma has been a role model for the Consular Corps, establishing an advisory committee within the Corps and increasing the level of engagement with the community through various functions and events. He approached his Dean's role with enthusiasm and professionalism. We all thank him for his service.

We are pleased to welcome our incoming Dean, Frank McGregor, Honorary Consul for the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland. Mr McGregor has had the advantage of observing five Deans before him and may continue some of their approaches as he leads the Corps for the next two years. I wish you the best of success as Dean.
