Through your programs, participants develop confidence, independence, and physical wellbeing, while also building friendships.

None of this would be possible without the volunteers and coaches who support your organisation. Your nationally accredited coaches lead with professionalism, and your volunteers are your foundation. Without volunteers, Riding for Disabled Tasmania simply could not operate. They are the reason this program has thrived for fifty years and will continue to thrive for many more.
