## **VICE-REGAL SALUTE**

Good afternoon, everyone. I warmly welcome you all to Government House to celebrate the Young Leaders of Tasmania School Buddies Program for 2025.

May I begin by acknowledging the Muwinina people upon whose land we gather. I acknowledge today's Tasmanian Aboriginal Community as ongoing custodians of Country. I recognise their enduring culture and deep connection to land, sea, sky, and waters.

This afternoon, we are recognising the young people who have promoted inclusion in our Tasmanian community by taking part in the School Buddies program. Together you have helped to promote understanding and to change peoples' perceptions of disability.

About one in five Australians lives with disability<sup>1</sup>. I quote, "they should experience their human rights – with equity, justice, dignity and respect."<sup>2</sup>

May I commend Young Leaders of Tasmania and founder Keren Franks, on your work to develop a statewide program bringing together students with disabilities and their peers in an inclusive education environment. I also acknowledge the Department for Education, Children and Young People for their support.

Today, we congratulate students from Bellerive and Howrah Primary Schools, Clarence High School and The Friends' School who have attended fortnightly visits at the Southern Support School in 2025.
